























AKC Tracking Invitational

The 2016 AKC National Tracking Invitational was held September 17 & 18, 2016 at Bernheim Arboretum and Research Forest, 2499 Clermont Rd, Clermont, KY40110. This was only the seventh time this event has been held which was open to all dogs earning the Champion Tracker (CT) title during the 'Qualifying Period' from January 1, 2008 through June 30, 2016. Of the dogs that were invited to enter, there were 51 entries for the event that was limited to 12 dogs. Minsk and I was one of the 12.
